All in-kind or financial gifts enhance and extend these valuable services to youth and families of East Oakland and Alameda County.





Our Mission

Our mission is to provide a range of culturally sensitive mental health services to youth and their families including prevention, early intervention, case management, coordination and collaboration with support services in the community.

Our treatment approach combines family crisis intervention techniques with ongoing counseling. We then assist the family in dealing with the underlying issues and pressures which led to the crisis.

Who We Are

We are a non-profit community-based 501(c)3 counseling agency that provides no-cost, time limited counseling services to families residing

in Alameda County and primarily in the community of East Oakland.

In 1976, the Alameda County Probation Deinstitutionalization of Status Offenders Program to provide an alternative method of service for the growing number of status offender (601) youth ages 8-18 years of age ending up in the juvenile justice system for running away, being truant and other adolescent acting out behaviors.

In 1978, the East Oakland Youth and Family Center incorporated as a non-profit and became the Center for Family Counseling East Oakland
In 2012, we were renamed the Carl B. Metoyer Center for Family Counseling in honor of one of our founders, Carl B. Metoyer.

What We Do

The following counseling services are provided at no-cost

- Short-term family therapy to East Oakland families with children ages 8-18 years old, and those on probation.
 - Diversion services to prevent involvement in the juvenile justice system.
 - Case management services: connecting youth and families to support services; advocating on behalf of youth and families to ensure school success, and act as a liaison for school, court and probation systems.
 - Crisis intervention services.
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Working with families in crisis, we recognize the following:

- The young person is part of the family and the family is part of the larger community, each part being affected by the other.
- When a family is in crisis, a solution involves all family members working toward a joint resolution.
- Families need follow-up services after the crisis has been resolved.
- All families and youth deserve services that are ethnically and culturally sensitive.

Our Staff

We have a diverse staff in race, ethnicity, gender, and language. Our clinical staff have Master's or Doctoral degrees in Clinical Psychology, Marriage and Family Therapy, or Social Work.

CBMFCC provides a training program for practicum students pursuing Ph.D., Psy.D., M.F.T. and M.S.W. degrees.

Family counseling interventions are taught through the lens of cultural responsive and sensitive practice.
